Ben Speer's Stamps-Baxter School of Music is an eight days-long Southern Gospel music school carrying on a 90-year tradition begun by J. R. Baxter Jr. and V.O. Stamps in the mid 1920s. And when we say "tradition," we mean it! We sing Southern Gospel and convention music, and we proudly teach shape notes.

Our school offers:

- Training in music theory
- Free electives in special topics like songwriting, conducting and performance training
- The opportunity to perform in front of the other students and receive feedback from professionals like
 Joyce Martin Sanders of The Martins

- Private lessons in voice, piano, songwriting, and instruments
- Twice-daily group singing
- Free concerts by Southern Gospel artists. Past artists have included
 The Martins, The Blackwood Brothers,
 The Nelons, Ivan Parker, The Perrys,
 and Ernie Haas & Signature Sound.

The heart of our school has always been the daily group singing, ear-training, sight-reading, and theory classes where students are divided into several different levels according to their individual ability and interest.







SHAPE NOTES

We are proud to teach traditional shape note convention-style music, doing our part to keep this traditional art form alive in the 21st century.

Music written with shape notes uses different symbols for the notes depending on which tone the note is in the scale. (To the left you can see Freddie Edwards's theory class holding up the symbols for each tone.) The purpose of using shape notes is to help make sight-singing quicker to learn, and our students can testify to the fact that it works. Plus, it's very cool to hear an entire verse sung just in shape notes!

GROUP SINGING

During twice-daily group singing you'll join with all your fellow students to practice singing and harmonizing in a larger group. We use conventionstyle music, a perennial favorite for its unique blend of emotion and rhythm, and for how incredibly fun it is to sing in a group!

ELECTIVES

We offer concentrated single-session workshops that provide students with the opportunity to get in-depth instruction from experts on specialized topics. Each workshop is offered on multiple days, so students usually get the opportunity to take all three during the course of the school.

Our songwriting workshop, which features discussions led by some of Christian Music's most successful songwriters like **Dave Clark** (shown at right), is extremely popular. We also typically offer an instrumentalist's workshop where students can learn the famed "Nashville Number System" from **Jack Clark,** and a conducting workshop for students interested in leading choirs.





PRIVATE LESSONS

We offer private lessons in voice, piano, songwriting, guitar and bass with talented instructors.

CLOSING PROGRAM

A highlight of the school is the Closing Program, which takes place on the final night. Our students perform as a choir, with chances for soloists to be featured singing verses. Students can also audition to perform either individually or as part of a group. We have soloists, quartets, instrumentalists, mixed



groups - almost every combination of singing and playing you can imagine. It's a great opportunity to sing together one last time as a student body and show what you've learned to friends and family!

Jack Clark is a songwriter, arranger, and quartet pianist who accompanied his first quatet at 12 years old. He's been hooked ever since on Gospel Music, and has spent decades teaching others the basics of the music he loves.

HOUSING

Students have the option to live on campus in a shared dorm room. All students are housed in Monohan Hall in double-occupancy rooms. The cost is just \$195 for all eight nights — that's less that \$25 per night!

If you prefer, you may also find your own lodging off campus at your own expense.

MEALS

The MTSU cafeteria serves three meals a day, and students can pay per meal. MTSU also has two food courts with outlets like Subway, Panda Express, Starbucks, and Bento Sushi. (Please note, however, that not all food court restaurants may be open during the school.)
